All About Coping Stones

Here at Attlebridge Concrete & Porcelain, there aren't many days when we're not making coping stones. We make them in 4 different styles for walls, and also make standard and bespoke copings for parapet roofs.

What's the function of a coping stone?

Apart from finishing off your building project aesthetically, a coping stone performs an important function. They are crucial in preventing rain from seeping through the wall. They include drip checks that help keep water away from the walls and prevent walls from weather damage.

What does OWTT and TWTT mean?

On our price lists you'll see the abbreviations OWTT and TWTT. OWTT stands for Once Weathered. These copings are designed to guide water in one direction. TWTT stands for Twice Weathered. These copings can also be called 'saddle-shaped'. They are inclined on both sides.

Why use a Flat Coping?

You may choose to use a flat style coping. These are the perfect choice on a wall where railings will be installed; for seating; or a more modern look.

Other Styles

As well as Once Weathered, Twice Weathered, and Flat Copings, we also make an Architectural Coping. These are in a twice weathered style, but are more decorative, with fluting at the bottom. Parapet Copings are made to put on the parapet wall of buildings. Again, their purpose is to provide a decorative finish and weather protection.
