## Pier Caps – The Crowning Glory

Recently we've all been witness to a piece of history with the Coronation of King Charles III. It seems like a good time to give you the low down on our crowning glory at Attlebridge Concrete and Porcelain – the Pier Cap.

A pier cap is the concrete pyramid or square shaped block that sits on top of a pier or gate pillar. They are designed to protect the pillar from the weather but also add a finishing touch to a wall.

Used alongside copings, pier caps protect the top of the wall, which is the most vulnerable area to the effects of the elements.

We make three types of pier caps here at Attlebridge Concrete & Porcelain: Standard; Architectural; and our new Flat Top Architectural.
